# **FROM THE PASTORS DESK...**

Wow! It's already Easter again! Easter is day. Jesus being raised from the dead the center of both our faith and our hope. But, for many ministers, including me, Easter Sunday is one of the most difficult to preach.

Now, it's not because we don't have plenty of scripture to choose from. Every Gospel, and some of the other New Testament books, gives detail accounts of Jesus' resurrection. In fact, the resurrection of Jesus was passed down verbally long before any of the New Testament was written.

It's also not because most folks haven't heard of the resurrection. There are people who don't profess a faith or who don't attend worship regularly that are able to at least give some details of the event.

So, what's the big deal? The thing I've struggled with for some twenty-one Easters is how to relate an event that is so familiar in a way that might make a difference in our life. I often think we've heard the story so many times that we've become immune to the importance and meaning of Easter. For many years I attempted to find some "hidden nugget" in the Easter story that might re-awaken our excitement and awe of Jesus being raised from the dead.

I've often wondered if, because of our familiarity with the resurrection, that folks become numb to its importance. I've often wondered if attending worship on Easter morning becomes a requirement to having a family lunch and being at the egg hunt in the afternoon. Have we become so indoctrinated to the resurrection that we use the day as an excuse for a new outfit and to dress up for one Sunday a year? Do folks come on Easter to "see and be seen" rather than renewing our awe and wonder of what the resurrection means for us?

Several years ago I came to a conclusion that may shock some folks. I realized that I needed to stop trying to find a new way to present the resurrection on Easter Sunwas familiar. I needed to own that fact and simply tell the story again. There's nothing new and different...it is familiar...let's claim that.

There's something about things being familiar. There's something about the sameness of the resurrection. Our familiarity with the resurrection account gives us the confidence that Jesus' victory is our victory. Since the resurrection story doesn't change, our future...and in fact our present doesn't change.

Now, I believe it's okay to know the resurrection story...it's okay to be familiar with the events of that first Easter morning. But, I also believe there's a difference between being familiar with the story...of knowing the story...and being comfortable with When we become comfortable it. with the resurrection it often ceases to make a difference in the way we live and relate to others. When we become comfortable with the story it's easy to believe we are worthy of eternal life.

So, take time to read that familiar story in the days ahead. Look at all the accounts of the resurrection. However, guard against becoming comfortable. Perhaps our familiarity with Jesus being raised from the dead will renew our faith and our drive to live in the power of the resurrection and share that story with others.

Happy Easter! He is risen...the Lord is risen indeed


