As you read this, Thanksgiving is over. Most of the leftovers have probably been consumed and the members of the family are back at home. Now, our attention turns to Christmas...if it didn't on Black Friday.

For many people the weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas are the busiest of the year. There are more family gatherings, parties for work and for church groups, and extra events at church to attend. All of this is in addition to scouring the malls and outlets for that "perfect" gift for someone that already has everything they need or want and might be returned or "re-gifted" at the first opportunity.

COOKIE TRAYS and PARTIES




Circle #1 will be selling Old Fashion Christmas Cookie Trays
