“It’s SNOW Cold Outside”






Several years ago, I read a story about Maya Angelou. Oprah Winfrey interviewed her on her 74th birthday. Oprah asked Angelou for some advice; and, the dam broke.

This lady gave some wonderful motivation for us all, with regard to how to live in The Way of Christ. Here are some excerpts from this interview with Dr. Angelou:

"I've learned that no matter what happens or how bad it seems today; life does go on and it will be better tomorrow. I've learned that you can tell a lot about a person by the way they handle these three things: a rainy day, lost luggage and tangled Christmas tree lights.

I've learned that regardless of your relationship with your parents, you'll miss them when they're gone from your life. I've learned that making a 'living' is not the same thing as making a 'life.'

I've learned that life sometimes gives you a second chance. I've learned that you shouldn't go through life with a catcher's mitt on both hands; you need to be able to throw some things back.

I've learned that whenever I decide something with an open heart, I usually make the right decision. I've learned that even when I have pains, I don't have to be one.

I've learned that every day you should reach out and touch someone. People love a warm hug, or just a friendly pat on the back.

I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel."

Did you catch that last part? *People will never forget how you made them feel!* I often feel this is the most important lesson that we can teach any child.

O the places you will go!!!!

What if in all of our travels during 2020, we gave much attention towards modeling this behavior for our children to see? I have heard it said that if all of us made the decision to work for peace, we'd never need militaries or police.

So, just maybe this year could be the year that we take Jesus at his word when he says, "I have come that they may have life and have it in abundance (John 10:10b Aramaic Text).
