## “Living In The Real World”

If you read my last article, “Enjoy Them Now,” you might appreciate the following story. In “Enjoy Them Now,” I addressed the “grandparent” figures that stop busy moms toting whiny young ones around the grocery store only to say, “Enjoy them now... they grow up so fast.” As a tired and weary mother of four, I felt certain that these people were from another planet – at least I did at the time.

Like many independent women of my generation, I took advantage of President Reagan’s tax incentives and cultivated a successful small business that I alone sustained, with the help of 15 employees. This stay-at-home-mom thing would not be my “dream job.” But just as my mother-in-law would assure me in those early days, the benefits of my “sacrifice” would reveal themselves later and make my misery all the worthwhile. It would be easy to assume that staying home with four kids and being married to an Italian from Cleveland for eighteen years, might turn a girl’s mind to mush. Grant it, I am not as “sharp” as I once was and at nearly 50 my memory’s failing me somewhat, but I remain just as “smart” as I was when I was running that booming business. Only now I possess a deeper, richer *wisdom* of the world that can only come with time and experience – and having committed *everything* to living, breathing and *bleeding* in the trenches of real, honest life. I understand the world -- and God’s purpose for me in it and, although I don’t always like my “assignments,” I try to be as faithful a servant as possible.

So you can imagine the distain I felt when, in the midst of a “marital discussion,” my hard-working husband said something stupid like, “You don’t know what’s going on in the business world. You don’t *live* in the “real world” anymore!” Well, God was with me at that moment -- which is the only reason why John is still breathing in and out – and without hesitation I replied, “Excuse me, Big Man, but it is *I* who is living in the “real world.” It is *you* who is out there working in a “fake world.” In your fake world, there is an abundance of competition, lying and deceit. Every day, decent people compromise their principles to get ahead.” “No, Johnny,” I repeated, “*I* live in the “real world.” In my world there is *love* and *kindness* and *caring* – *feeding, clothing and nurturing*. “My world” makes *everything* happen!” Then, as if by “magic,” I swear I saw God turn that light bulb on in his head – and he nodded in agreement and said, “You’re right, Rosebud, you’re right.” “Good answer,” I thought. “Good answer!”
