We are pleased to announce that tuitions will not increase for the 2018-19 school year. There will be an increase in the Registration Fee. We will go from \$60.00 to \$75.00. The good news is that if you register your child during the month of February, your registration fee will only be \$50.00 for your first child, a savings of \$10.00 from the 2017-18 rate and a \$25.00 savings over the new 2018-19 rate. With Love from Claudia

In February, our thoughts turn to thoughts of love. We are going to concentrate on how parents love their children and how that love effects how that child will give love. As you know when that first baby arrives in your home, they do not come with an instruction book; and frankly, the whole idea of a How To book would not help, because our children are different. I will never forget when we brought our daughter, Heather, home and it seemed the weight of the world was on my shoulders. I wanted to give her everything, but I did not want to raise a spoiled child, who had feelings of entitlement.

A famous poem was written, "Children Learn by What They Live" by Dorothy Law Nolte, Ph.D. in 1954. She wrote a weekly column on child rearing and composed the 14-line poem, when she was searching for something to write about. It soon became a mantra for all parents. I had a copy in the nursery, on the refrigerator and taped inside a cabinet door. Following is the poem that she wrote:

If children live with criticism, they learn to condemn.

If children live with hostility, they learn to fight.

If children live with fear, they learn to be apprehensive.

If children live with pity, they learn to feel sorry for themselves.

If children live with ridicule, they learn to feel shy.

If children live with jealousy, they learn to feel envy.

If children live with shame, they learn to feel guilty.

If children live with encouragement, they learn confidence.

If children live with tolerance, they learn patience.

If children live with praise, they learn appreciation.

If children live with acceptance, they learn to love.

If children live with approval, they learn to like themselves.

If children live with recognition, they learn it is good to have a goal.

If children live with sharing, they learn generosity.

If children live with honesty, they learn truthfulness.

If children live with fairness, they learn justice. If children live with kindness and consideration, they learn respect.

If children live with security, they learn to have faith in themselves and in those about them. If children live with friendliness, they learn the world is a nice place in which to live Parents, remember, you can talk until you are blue in the face, spout out rules and talk in an extreme voice, but it is not so much what you say but what your children see you do. Children are not naturally born with these qualities. They must be taught and their main teacher is YOU.

Life Skills Camp
